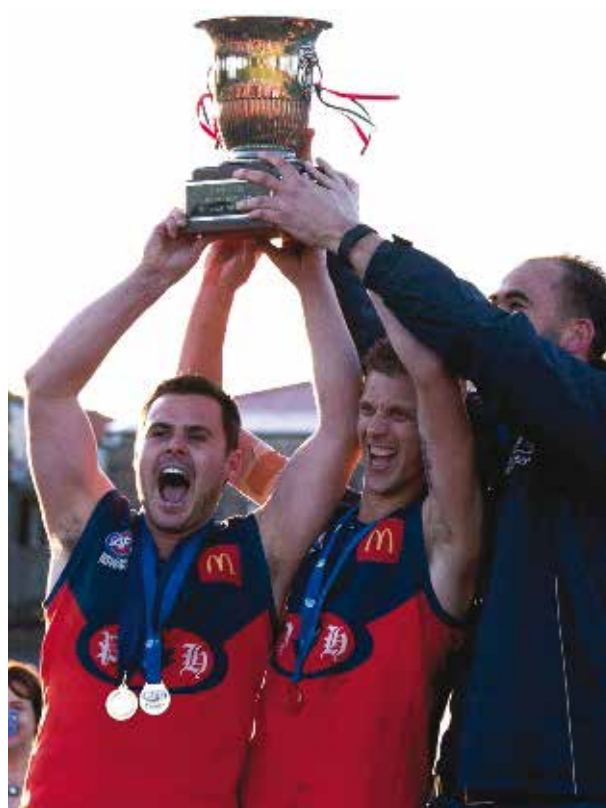

# Welcome – President's Report



What an extraordinary year for our great Club. Our welcoming, family-focused, culture continued to see new players attracted to the game of Aussie Rules, and, more particularly, to our Club. This saw the extraordinary step taken by the Club to introduce two new teams - a second Under 19 team and a Division 5 team for the first time. Extraordinarily, the Club has doubled from 3 teams in 2012 to 6 teams in 2015!

We commenced the 2015 season with much optimism, but realistic that on-field the year would be a challenge for all teams; but particularly in Premier Division with East Coast returning from the NEAFL competition. As things turned out, by season's end, to be honest, the results far exceeded all our expectations.

Of our six teams, five qualified for finals, two for Grand finals and of course the ultimate success of a Premier Division Flag was an outcome beyond our wildest imaginings and to this day I have to pinch myself to reassure me it really happened. Add to this, winning the Club Championship, and by these measures Pennant Hills was arguably the most successful Club in the Sydney AFL and makes 2015 one of the most successful years in the Club's history.

To achieve on-field success, firstly I need to acknowledge our exceptional group of players, living out the Club's mantra ... *"Club – Team – Self"* ... throughout the season and then, during finals, motivated and invigorated by the *"Local and Loyal"* theme, which culminated in an unrivalled team effort in the Premier Division Grand Final. Thank you to our outstanding coaches and team managers, personified by Senior Club Coach Chris Yard, who achieved the ultimate success, but who also should be recognised for continuing to develop all players within our Club to become better footballers, as well as better men. Chris led our Club and our team coaches of Jason Clarke (Division 1), Nathan Breen (Division 3), Nick and Mike Baglin (Division 5), David Pinker Under 19s (overall and Division 1), and Todd Williams (Under 19 Division 2). Each Coach was supported by the most important role in Community Football – the team Manager. Again thank you to Phil Moraitis, Phil Scarlett, John Acheson, Owen Baglin, Michael Trenaman and Scott McNeillage. Thank you to all coaches and team managers.

Off-field, the Club also had great success. Social events undertaken this season included the Ski Party, Bogan Bingo and the annual Ladies Day at Mike Kenny Oval. All of these events were well attended and contribute to building a Club culture that emphasises inclusiveness and sharing. Thanks to Jill Angel, Macca and the rest of the social committee for arranging these events.

After Thursday training sessions throughout the season, we hosted the weekly *'Club Thursday'* BBQ which allowed all the boys to fuel up and re-hydrate after the rigours of the training track. Thanks to all the volunteers who manned the BBQ and Bar on these evenings. Wayne 'Razor' Keating's roast beef rolls became a particular favourite!

Fielding two new teams this season proved to be an enormous strain on committee and volunteer time and resources. As such, mid-way through the season, the Club engaged Josh Mott as Club Administrator to coordinate match-day volunteer rosters, the canteen, BBQ and various Club functions during the second half of the season. In only a short period of time Josh was able to implement new procedures that streamlined some of those key off-field functions which are critical to the smooth and efficient running of a community football club. Thanks to

Josh for his efforts and to Tom Edmonds who supported Josh in the role of communications coordinator. Attendance at this season's Presentation Night numbered around 200 players, family and friends, twice as many as in 2014, and the overwhelming response this season is attributed to the efforts of Josh and Tom in promoting this most important of end-of-season events.

During the season, improvements made to our facilities at Mike Kenny Oval included new Club and sponsor signage (in conjunction with the Westbrook Junior Club and the Greenway Giants Baseball Club), carpeting of the change rooms and installation of a roller door between the home and opposition rooms to create a larger meeting space. With the assistance of Hornsby Shire Council, new demountable goal posts were installed at Mike Kenny Oval and a second set of goal posts installed on the bottom oval, Greenway Park, which became the Demons' second home ground for the first time in 2015. Throughout 2015, discussions with Council concerning the feasibility of a new Sports House at Mike Kenny Oval were ongoing. Unfortunately, nothing is yet set in concrete, however, we will know more about the prospects for the Sports House proposal during 2016. So, stay tuned!

The addition of two new teams significantly increased the financial pressure on our Club, and this pressure would not have been able to be met without the support of our dedicated Sponsors. We thank and acknowledge our new Icon Sponsor of McDonalds (Thornleigh & Castle Hill), our Tier 1 sponsors of The Epping Club, Ritera Group, West Pennant Hills Sports Club and AJQ Business & Technology Consulting. Our sponsor partners extend to the Forum Group, Supershades (Accent Blinds), Silk Logistics Group, National Weighing and Blue Collar Recruitment. We truly thank and acknowledge all of our Club sponsors, for without your support our Club would struggle to field our current number of teams.

The end of this season also sees the retirement of one of the Club's longest serving administrators – Ian 'Chicken' Parker. After 26 years involvement with Westbrook (8) and Pennant Hills (18), Ian has decided not to stand for the Committee or the Vice President role that he has occupied for many seasons, in 2016. Ian has been the beating heart of the Club's administration for such a long time and stepping back will leave a huge hole that will require several new people to fill his enormous shoes. He's done most jobs in the Club at different times and has been the "keeper of records" for many-a-year. He leaves a vacuum that will be hard to fill, however, to his credit he leaves the Club in arguably the best state it's ever been in. He deserves recognition for the contribution he has made over many years. Few people have given so much to a community football club as Ian has given to his beloved Demons. His work ethic, experience, deep knowledge and systematic approach to running the Club will be sorely missed. There is little doubt that the Club is in better shape for his involvement.

On behalf of the Committee, players, past and present, and the Sydney footy community more broadly, I pay tribute to Ian and thank him for the excellent contribution he has made to this football club over such a long period of time. I am certain that he will not be completely lost to the Club and that we will continue to see him around the grounds during the footy season. Congratulations and best of luck 'Chicken'!

Finally, I would like to thank and acknowledge the work of our outstanding "family" of volunteers that allow our Club to function. From Al "The Barman" Abbott (Club Person of the Year), John Acheson, our Club Historian and News writer (President's Award), to all on the

The outstanding on-field success of the Club in 2015 is well documented elsewhere in this Yearbook.

The true measure of the Club's progression is best demonstrated by the number of other remarkable steps taken by the Club this year.

- Increasing our on field playing level from 4 teams (3 teams 2 years earlier) to a Club record 6 teams and around 190 players.
- Managing to fund the 50% increase in Club operating costs resulting from the extra teams whilst at the same time maintaining player welfare measures and funding important facility improvements at Mike Kenny Oval.
- Dealing with the natural year-on-year increases in each of the core expenditure areas of AFL affiliation and umpires, insurance, ground hire and equipment and physiotherapy.

The work of our President Phil Hare and the Committee has driven the Club's progress in the past year and it is the major challenge of the Club to maintain and continue the development of the Club and its almost 200 players by ensuring the necessary infrastructure and volunteer support is in place to enable the teams to get on the field each week.

There is evidence elsewhere in the Sydney competition of Clubs falling into decline after key volunteers retire or move on and everyone associated with the Club has a role to play in ensuring that our Club does not follow the same path, everyone at the Club whether they be a player, parent or family member, each must become conscious of the need to contribute at some stage and not wait to be asked.

The financial challenge to the Club remains, remarkably we produced a small profit this year, thanks to our fantastic sponsors who helped us get the 6 teams onto the field this year. We must continue to give value and support to our sponsors as without them we will have no Club.

The Club continues to liaise with Hornsby Council and the AFL with a view of establishing a Sports House at Mike Kenny Oval incorporating club rooms and viewing areas, to be shared with Baseball, Westbrook

Juniors and other sporting groups. A feasibility/costing exercise is currently underway by Hornsby Council and hopefully this project will materialise sooner rather than later, although it is a big ticket project.

This season has seen major improvements in the change rooms at Mike Kenny Oval and we are extremely fortunate to be able to gain access to the lower ground at Greenway Park in Season 2015 under a sharing arrangement with Penno Stags Rugby League. This enabled the Club at times to run 6 matches at the same venue with games operating on the upper and lower grounds at the same time, providing a unique environment for home matches.

Finally, all plaudits must go to Chris Yard, the coaching group and, above all, the players who provided us with an unforgettable Premier Division Flag.

The Club's doctrine of "Club" first then "Team" then "Self" was evident in the disciplined approach which delivered the Premier Division Flag.

Let's all keep that doctrine alive so we continue a Club culture envied by other Clubs.

I would like to acknowledge the work by our Treasurer Brendan who spent dozens of hours ensuring our financial area was under control, which enabled the Committee to work its way through a Season of substantial growth within the Club knowing where we were financially and what was required to keep the additional teams on the field.

This was so important during the period of new/extra teams that was Season 2015 where we were venturing into uncharted waters.

To all the volunteers involved in the Club, thank you for making Season 2015 such a memorable one.

For the first time in the Club's history, Pennant Hills AFC fielded six teams in the Sydney AFL competition, adding a Division 5 side for the first time and a second Under 19s side in 2015. Concurrently, the Club negotiated use of Greenway Park (the bottom oval) as our second home ground enabling a number of Super Saturdays when five, or on one occasion, all six teams played at home.

Making this possible were our good friends at Hornsby Shire Council who oversaw installation of new demountable goal posts on Mike Kenny Oval and new permanent AFL posts on Greenway Park. We are also grateful to each of the co-tenants, Greenway Giants Baseball and Pennant Hills Stags Junior Rugby League, who generously accommodated our fixture requirements throughout the season.

The major highlights for the Club were victory in the Premier Division Grand Final, winning the Bill Hart Trophy for the 4<sup>th</sup> time, and overall winning the Sydney AFL's Club Championship.

Team highlights for season 2015 were:

- Premier Division finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> after the home and away rounds and then beating hot favourites East Coast Eagles to take the Flag ... the top prize in the Sydney AFL;
- Division One finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in a tough competition and then were unlucky runners-up in the Grand Final, losing by one measly point;
- Division Three finishing 4<sup>th</sup> and played one final;
- Division 5 finishing 5<sup>th</sup> and won two finals before bowing out in the Preliminary Final;
- Under 19 Division One were minor premiers but ran out of steam before season's end, bowing out in straight sets in the finals;
- Under 19 Division Two finishing 6<sup>th</sup>, just missing out on playing finals.

On an individual note some of the highlights were:

- Damien Dell'Aquila and Matt Carey were once again co-captains;
- Damien Dell'Aquila won the Rod Podbury Medal for Best on Ground in the Grand Final;
- Veterans Jason Clarke and Anthony Brawn both reached their 300 game milestones. Unfortunately, both lost their milestone games and were runners-up in the Division One Grand Final;
- Brant Jack and Luke Bilbe both reached their 200 game milestones.

For our Premier Division side, 2015 caps off a long-running period of success this century, which started with the Club's inaugural first grade flag in 2000. Over the past 16 years, Pennant Hills has won four first grade premierships, was runner-up twice and has qualified for finals in 12 consecutive seasons 2004 – 15, and 14 out of the past 16 seasons. This is a credit to everyone involved at Pennant Hills during this period ... the players, coaches, parents, volunteers and committee people. We are a local community club where we play for the love of the game, our team-mates and for the Club itself. The recent record of success is nothing short of phenomenal. So, well done to everyone involved.

For the man at the helm, in particular, Chris Yard has now been the senior coach for the past four seasons and results under his tutelage just get better and better. His team has competed in finals every year so far, were runners-up in the two previous seasons and the ultimate success of a Premier Division Flag was achieved in the season just gone, 2015. Congratulations to YD, he is indisputably a legend of this great club and no-one deserves this season's success like he does.

The addition of two new teams this season added significantly to the off-field and game-day administration and work-load, to an extent not anticipated by Club officials. All teams need coaches, managers, runners and water-boys, positions all filled by volunteers. Further, the lower grade teams need to variously supply field, goal and boundary umpires; again, by recruitment of volunteers. Week-by-week it was a challenge to fill these positions and brought unwarranted stress to those few who were called on to do too much. What's more, running two grounds on home rounds provided its own challenges including the need to duplicate the functions of ground manager, time-keepers and scoreboard. All of this was immensely challenging and stretched our volunteer resources to the limit and occasionally past breaking point. In retrospect it was a phenomenal effort by all those involved, but in particular I single out Club President, Phil Hare.

I take this opportunity to acknowledge the work ethic, commitment and energy that Phil has brought to the Club over the past two seasons. His load was immense but the manner in which he dealt with it, without complaint, was superb and to a significant degree the success of 2015 should be attributed to him. He gave selflessly throughout the season of his time, effort and organisational acumen. You need good players and a great coach to win a flag, but without a doubt this is only possible if the Club is organised and run by energetic and committed people behind the scenes. We are fortunate to have Phil and many other keen and engaged people with the sole aim of making Penno the best club it can be.

The engagement of Josh Mott to assist in the many and varied administrative tasks at the Club proved to be a master-stroke and went a long way to alleviating the workload pressures in the second half of the season. The message for next season, however, is clear. We will need to be better organised pre-season and will need many "more hands to the pumps" if we are to continue to be a successful 'professionally' run community footy club. To this end, I encourage everyone with an interest in this great Club to commit some time to help out and to bring along family, partners and friends to be a part of this fantastic undertaking.

Wow, what an awesome season 2015 turned out to be ... Premiership Glory for the mighty Demons!

After being beaten in the last couple of Grand Finals in 2013 and '14, we embarked on another pre-season that was going to be slightly different and tougher. I wanted an increase in the level of fitness and we were really happy when Maddy Cove decided to take the reins, developing and delivering our season 2015 fitness program. It was certainly as rigorous as expected and the boys really pushed themselves to the limits. This certainly gave us a great springboard into the season. Great job Maddy, thank you.

The season started slightly later this year and with the late withdrawal of Campbelltown, we became a 9 team competition. This meant an additional bye and, at one stage, a 'strange' 3 weeks off football with wet weather, the representative weekend and the bye.

Some of the highlights of the home and away season were:

- Two wins over our new arch-rivals – Manly, and a couple of 'come from behind' victories;
- Four rising stars nominations – Campbell Luscombe, Brad Keough, Nathan Cooper and Connor Owen-Auburn;
- Sydney AFL representatives – Matt Carey and James Dunn. Matt Carey was also named Captain;
- Debuts – A number of guys played their first game in Premier Division for the Club. Congratulations to Campbell Luscombe, Connor Owen-Auburn, Cooper Lee, James Carroll, Michael Johnston and Patrick Witt. The Club's future is certainly in good hands;
- Used 37 players throughout the season; and
- Sydney AFL Team of the Year representatives – Kieran Wright, Matt Carey and Tom Angel.

Moving through the home and away season, we had sealed a top 3 spot and a double chance some 4 weeks out from the season-end. This allowed us to concentrate on our 'build' program for the finals campaign. We went about polishing up on the areas of our game that needed work – skills and a few punishing training sessions to hone our fitness.

The finals series finally arrived and it was a Grand Final replay again, Manly vs Pennant Hills in the Qualifying Final (2<sup>nd</sup> vs 3<sup>rd</sup>). As we had done twice before this season we went on to claim the victory by 18 points and we were definitely the better side all day.

Victory over Manly meant we were up against the competition favourites, East Coast Eagles, in the second semi-final. The boys were fantastic in this game and we certainly took it up to our more fancied opponents through our hardness and pressure which denied East Coast the ability to play their own game. We were beaten by 12 points, but the group took a great deal of confidence from how we went about it and what we saw in our opponents. We were still alive but now faced St George in the Preliminary Final – for the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year.

To that point in the season, this was the game of the Finals that I was most worried about, concerned that the boy's minds were already on the following week's Grand Final, provided we won of course. We fell in by a mere 3 points with the Dragons almost running us down; but in finals it doesn't really matter how you do it or by how much ... a win is a win, regardless.

That meant it was onto our 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive Grand Final and it was against our traditional Hills rivals in East Coast Eagles. This season's Grand Final venue, Henson Park, was the scene of two of our previous three Premiership Flags, where, coincidentally our opponents had been the Eagles.

This time around, East Coast were the red hot favourites to win – coming back from the NEAFL with a star-studded team and only losing one game for the season – their first. Well, well, well, '*Local and Loyal*' (our mantra for the day) won out. With a tricky wind at times, our boys played some great footy, none better than the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter for the first 12 minutes or so. Whilst not pretty, it was hard and contested with no easy possessions. We managed to hold East Coast with the wind to one goal and go into 3 quarter time only 9 points down. During the 3 quarter time break, I asked the group to stick with our plan, continue to play our style and take our fantastic level of pressure to another level ... and, that we did! It was neck and neck for the early stages of the final quarter and then at about the 11 minute mark of the last quarter the game broke open – in our favour. We went on to kick 8 goals for the quarter and run out convincing winners by 35 points. Our final score was 14 goals 5 behinds, amazing given our accuracy through the year was around only 50%.

What a moment when the siren sounds, after 9 months of hard work you've finally achieved the ultimate prize. Here's a stat for you. In the last 20 Reserve Grade Grand Finals there has been 5 decided by the barest possible margin. That's one thriller every four years. Just imagine getting a 1-point thriller in the AFL every four years ... ridiculous!

Even better than that stat is that one team has been involved in FOUR of those 5 games. Just let that soak in, will you? One team ... four Grand Finals ... decided by one point ... I'll give you one guess who that is?? For the record, since 1996, Pennant Hills Reserves has competed in 8 Grand Finals, with a win/loss ratio of 1 and 7. Three were lost by a solitary point and the last flag won, in 1996, was also decided by a single point!

The beginnings of the 2015 season began soon after the loss to Macquarie University in the 2014 Semi Final. Having not tasted Finals action after some 5 years it was clear the group wanted more, however what was equally clear was that, to achieve that goal, a far more committed attitude was required.

That commitment was evident in the early pre-season, with excellent numbers attending. Something had certainly clicked in the group, and there was a more determined and professional attitude towards both the pre-season and training in general. Even Brawny and Magic were sighted before April!

Our performances throughout the home and away season saw the continued improvement over previous years. With the strength of the Division 1 competition always on the improve, via the use of the relegation system (this year saw Wollongong and Penrith making way for Sydney University and a resurgent East Coast), we managed to defy popular opinion and surpass last year's win/loss ratio by 1 ½ games and improved on point scoring by around 200 points over the previous year. This saw us climb from last year's 5<sup>th</sup> position into 3<sup>rd</sup> and secure that critical double chance in the Finals.

Highlights during the home and away season were many, but head and shoulders above the rest was the round 10 victory against a previously undefeated Balmain at Henson Park. In one of the highest scoring and skilful games of our year, an 8 goal 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter saw the boys hand the Tigers their first defeat. Other highlights were big wins over UTS and Macquarie, and a rare victory at Olds Park vs St George. Something that was particularly pleasing was the fact that we did not lose consecutive games for the entire season. Compared to last season, where we lost 6 in a row, that achievement was an indication of the growing maturity of the players.

Scattered amongst the year were a few losses that were very disappointing. Giving up decent leads to Southern Power and Balmain where particularly concerning and highlighted a lack of concentration throughout a game that we worked hard on eliminating as the season progressed. What was also very clear was that if we went into a game not switched on we were generally in for a bad day as evidenced by big losses to East Coast (round 11) and Macquarie Uni (round 3).

The Finals were both exhilarating and heartbreaking all in one. The Semi Final versus the Flag favourites UTS was particularly satisfying. After leading by 4 goals to nothing in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter we ended up trailing come ¾ time. Yet the group warmed to the challenge and defied recent team form and came out eventual winners. We found ourselves in a similar situation the next week against Balmain. Leading by 3 goals at ¾ time, the Tigers brought the margin back to 5 points before we kicked the next 6 to go out eventual winners by 41 points. Such a win gave the group both enormous confidence and a refreshing week off – we had just beaten the top two sides, we were first into the Grand Final, and Flag favourites to boot!

Grand Final week presented its own difficulties with the competition amongst players for spots in the team red hot. Unfortunately, only 22 can be picked and particular note must be made here to Fraser Nixon, Luke Turner and Dave Smith, who unfortunately missed selection. Certainly, the hardest decision in my short coaching career! Credit must go to you all for your maturity and understanding despite your obvious disappointment. Come game day, and the fact that all three of you were out there doing your bit for

the team, speaks volumes of your selfless attitudes.

Given I have just watched the replay (Pinot Noir in hand) I'm not going to go into depth on it, but as we all well know, 1 point losses are heartbreaking. One point losses in Grand Finals can be soul destroying. Without any doubt whatsoever, that game was the ONE that got away! We had more of the ball yet failed to use it efficiently, and did not capitalise when in front of goals. Credit must go to Sydney University who took their opportunities when presented, and tackled in those final minutes as if their very lives depended on it. What our group must take out of that loss, apart from a burning desire to make amends, is the confidence in our incredible character to come from 5 goals down and in a seemingly hopeless position to get ourselves oh so close. A prouder coach you could not find.

Looking beyond the win and losses as a measure of success, 2015 saw the Division 1 team, for the first time in a very long time, successfully performing arguably its most important role in the club (IMO). That being, to provide a place for those First Grade footballers who are kicking on the door for promotion while biding their time until such an opportunity arises. For far too long the lack of depth in the Division 1 team has seen the U19s as the first port of call when 1<sup>st</sup> Grade comes looking for it's next group of players. However, this this season we saw Pat Witt, Adam Nixon and Lachy Vile promoted for long stretches in First Grade footy. In a further nod to the improvement of the group we also saw numerous First Graders such as Ranga Ediriwickrama, Sam Widmer, Teddy Widmer, Sam Zikman, Tim Wales and Nick Hey all spend time with us for either fitness or form reasons, something (which certainly in the last 4 seasons) has been the exception rather than the rule. Credit must be given to those whom did spend time with us, for the group fed off their positive attitude, and professional way they attacked the game.

The Award Winners:

**Best & Fairest:** Brant Jack – What a year? After making a successful rehabilitation from a knee injury, it was heartening to hear that Schmack was going around again in 2015. His influence to the group was immediate, with his ball handling skills only matched by his ability to win contested footy. Schmack gave us an endless supply of football around the ground. What he also provided was the leadership and direction to a very skilful, but young and developing midfield group that was sorely needed. Although I'm not too sure placing bets at Caulfield at half-time (in cahoots with Wayno and Barnsey) is something I would want too many of the other lads doing.

**Runner Up B&F:** Robbie Watts – After an injury plagued few years for Robbie we got to see his true ability this year. Playing in the traditional Ruck Rover position Robbie is one of those players where the game just seems to *sloooooow downnnnn* when the ball is in his hands. With all the time in the world, his delivery to the forwards was first class, and then when up forward he provided us with a tall marking target and reliable kick for goal. Could have gone one better if he brought the amazing Jenny along to more games!

**Most Consistent:** Luke Turner – After an injury that saw him sit out half the 2014 season Booker came back with a vengeance in 2015. Playing across the wings he was a true 70m player, breaking lines with pace and delivering raking accurate passes. Alas, a hamstring injury struck him down late in the season, it was heart-breaking to see him miss the Finals series. Having said all that, I get the feeling that sometimes simply he used football as an excuse to get out of the house and to get to the skate park behind the change-rooms.

**Most Improved:** Brayden Tos - A maturing U19 travelling down from the Central Coast; a lack of a pre-season saw him start in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade. As the season wore on and he gained some fitness he soon worked his way into the Division 1 side, where his ruck tapwork, strong overhead marking and great attack on the ground ball saw him promoted for a Premier Division appearance. By the end of the season, Tossy was the form player in the squad, and can look forward to a cracking 2016. Clearly the best 'ginger' in the club ... yes, Timmy Wales ... even better than you.



**Best Team Man:** Fraser Nixon – He is a credit to himself and the Club. After being asked to step aside as Captain of the side he had every right to feel aggrieved, but in his true selfless fashion he continued on fulfilling everything he had for the previous years without a second thought. He missed two training sessions all year, played forward and back and was always the first to volunteer when 'Doc' Moraitis came looking for water runners for 1<sup>st</sup> Grade. But most of all, it was his attitude at the end of the year when he missed selection for Finals that cast his true, amazing nature. In a Competition that is always improving we have defied all expectations to, not only make Finals, but go within a whisker of winning the big one. Arguably,

more important than on-field success, was the high level of enjoyment that the season provided. The feeling amongst the group was fantastic and there was a real sense of camaraderie amongst the boys.

Despite the overwhelming sadness after the GF loss there was a real positivity amongst the players ... a determination to return next year and right the wrongs, to improve on our weaknesses and finesse our strengths. I suppose pre-season 2016 will determine if all that was real or just the slabs of beer talking, but I, for one, can't wait.

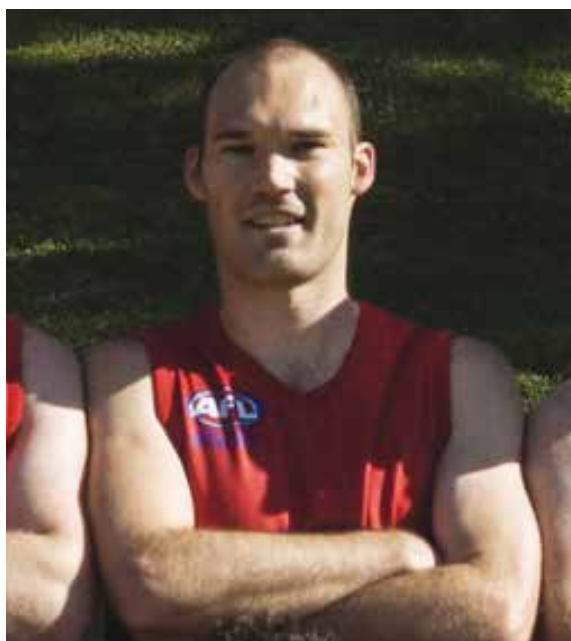

# Division Three Coach's Report



The numbers: 19 games, 10 wins, 9 losses, 1,333 points for, 1,153 against. Pennant Hills played their second season of Division 3 football and were looking to improve on the previous season's finals campaign. One new coach, two new managers, a new ground and 15 new Demons to add to the senior list. In fact, all up, 53 players ran out for Division 3 this season. These players fought in every game to finish 4<sup>th</sup> at the end of the home and away season – the same position we finished in 2014.

Despite leading at ¾ time or later in 4 of the first 6 rounds, the Dees were sitting at 1 and 5 and a mid-season review probably would have had the coach a little worried. What, with murmurs coming from the back of board meetings, a new coach may not have been far away.

However, round 7 would prove to be a turning point in our season. With only 18 on the team sheet, Pennant Hills made the road trip to Gosford. With limited options for rotations and players playing in unfamiliar positions the Red and Blue seemed to run harder, push to more contests, and placed more tackling pressure on the opposition than we ever had before. Whilst the scoreboard indicated a comfortable win, thanks largely to a 4 goal display from Josh Mott, it was worth more than the 4 competition points, it was at this time that we decided we were good enough to play in this competition; that our best was as good as anyone else's. We could play footy, but now we had learnt how to win!

To the boys credit we never panicked about our ladder position. In fact, we hadn't played that badly, nor had we played that well, and it was that Gosford game that would start the ball rolling, helping us to win the next 4 straight and out-scoring our opponents by 116 points. At 5 and 5, belief was high and a finals berth once again seemed possible.

We then played Penrith and East Coast in two games that definitely came back to haunt us. Against 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Penrith, away from home, we let ourselves down, our skills were poor and with turnovers aplenty, we leaked way too many points. However, we never gave up and with a minute left in the game a captain's goal by Danny Strange (playing deep in the back pocket) put us in front by 5 pts. What followed from the centre bounce was tantamount to highway robbery from a partisan umpiring incident that even the home team found embarrassing! Mind you, some poor discipline made it all the worse and the Dees' went home heart-broken, going down by a solitary point.

Despite their lowly ladder position, East Coast proved to be our kryptonite during the season (2 games, 2 losses) and in the end cost us a run at the top 3 and a dip at the second chance. This 'blip on the radar' would only prove to motivate the team. Knowing we needed to win some tough games in the last month, the side would beat eventual premiers Sydney University (Away), Minor premiers UTS Bats (Home) and, at the time, 4<sup>th</sup> placed Nor-West Jets (Away). This month of football had the team riding a wave of success and in every way we had gone from that team that 'never goes away' to a genuine contender for the title.

However, the biggest disappointment was yet to come – back-to-back games against 5<sup>th</sup> placed Western Suburbs, which was the form side in the last month or so, their playing stocks bolstered by some quality players coming down from Division 1, given West's Firsts and Reserves were no-shows for finals.

The first of these encounters, Round 18, the final home and away game, saw Pennant Hills revert back to its early season inconsistency. We argued with the umpire, with each other and played selfish football. We were second to the ball, used it poorly and put very little pressure on

the ball carrier. The only bright spot would come from Ollie Brodie who showed his class all day rebounding out of the back line. The under-manned Demons played without vigour or passion and had their colours lowered; undoubtedly, the flattest performance for the year, which left the boy's confidence reeling one week out from finals. Having said all that, playing at Picken Oval is always a challenge. Wests are, at any time an intimidating opponent, but at Picken they become a daunting prospect.

The second time we played the resurgent Wests side was in the following week's Elimination Final. Eight team changes for Penno, a beautiful day, a far improved facility (Blacktown ISP) and a much better feeling in the change rooms couldn't, unfortunately, be translated to the desired result. We couldn't counter the half back and midfield surge of a more experienced Western Suburbs side, that included 10 higher grade players – including 3 former/current Premier Division players. However, Pennant Hills didn't give up all day, it was a spirited contest by the Dees this time around. However, we broke down across the half-forward line time and time again, while Wests were able to get the ball one-out to the best forward in Division 3, Matt Eurell. With his six goals, he kicked the game out of reach. We knew our fate was sealed at ¾ time but that didn't stop us winning the last quarter of the game (4 goals to 1); something that says a lot about the courage and tenacity of the group that played in the 'Red & the Blue' in season 2015.

People say you are only as good as your last game – I don't believe this to be true. I remember a side that was able to fight back and come from behind against quality opposition. I remember a side that was able to dismantle the benchmark team of the competition (UTS) in 3 of the best quarters I have been a part of with this great Club. I remember a side that fought in every contest they were presented this season. I remember a lower grade side that didn't play like a lower grade side and I remember a team that played 19 games, a side that played a final, a side that sung the song loud and proud on 10 occasions, but more importantly a side that had 53 blokes find a way to be a hero when that's what the team needed. Flags are rare and difficult things – but we were right in the mix in 2015 and that's where I would like to be again in 2016. Congratulations to the whole squad and I look forward to seeing you on the track for another genuine crack at the title next season.

**Best and Fairest: Darren Boulet** – How handy is a key position player that can play as a mid-fielder? A ruck man that wins his own clearance? A centre half-forward that crums his own goal? Or, a player that has 'no drama' in doing whatever roll is required. Daz, as he is affectionately known, played only 14 games and was named as a Ruckman, Centre Half Forward, Full Forward, Fullback and Midfielder. He did it all, without complaint, and more importantly he did it all well. He was sorely missed in the final series suffering from a bad groin injury, but regardless had a stellar season.

**R/U Best and Fairest and Players' Player: David Gardner** – Gard's first year with the Club saw him also play 14 games with Division 3. A hard running half back, Disco's ability to win the ball in the back half and use it very well was what enabled Penno to launch attack from defence. He uses the ball skillfully and rarely loses a one-on-one battle. Disco was a fantastic team asset and a player that would have given opposition coaches plenty of headaches on game day.

Finally, if I was to individually thank everyone who helped me and the team out this season, then I would surely run out of paper. But I will single out a few who made a special contribution. To Nick and Mike

# Division 5 Coaches Report



In the inaugural season for Division 5 expectations were to provide a game for anybody who wanted to be a part of this fantastic Club. Predicted to finish last by the Sydney AFL we turned up to round 1 at Rosedale Park to take on Moorebank, scrounged together 20 players, won the game and never looked back. Throughout the season, Division 5 was able to field over 60 players. Some weeks our average age was above 30 years, other weeks below 20 years. A Division 5 side requires the huge support of the Club, whether it be a Club Captain turning up to run water in a final, a first year player bringing someone to do goal umpiring or the veterans of the club returning for games just to get the team onto the paddock; all of which occurred weekly throughout the year and did not go unnoticed.

To make it into the finals series this year exceeded all expectations from a coaching standpoint. - Annie (Cupcake) Gardiner, thank you for being our physio and getting us on the park each week, having to deal with phantom knee injuries, hairy backs, and general old age must be tough but you did it with a smile each week and your finals cupcakes are ultimately what kept us winning!
- Owen and Graham Baglin, thank you for being the utilities this year, whether it be team manager towards the end of the season or turning up in the cold at Randwick to goal umpire, both of your efforts are greatly appreciated.
- Finally to Cuz, Yardy, Boxy, Ol'Man Gunna and Clarkey for providing the support and interest each week in the team. Your guidance and support throughout the year has made a huge difference to the team and to the growth of both Mike and I in our coaching careers.

To everybody else involved, be they spectators, water runners, club umpires, family and friends, thank you all for your support in making the year what it was and we look forward to bigger and better things in 2016.

# Under 19 Division One Coach's Report



I said last year that we'd look back at 2014 as the 'one that got away' and there's little doubt that the same can be said about this season, but for entirely different reasons.

The major success for 2015 for me was being able to put a second Under 19's side on the park. This was one of my major goals when I took the job on at the end of 2012 and, if the age groups between junior and senior footy hadn't changed last year, we may have been able to do it earlier.

I didn't realise how much work would go into getting two sides on the park each week and my thanks and admiration go to Todd Williams for his unwavering dedication in coaching the second side.

Many times we were able to get two sides together with under 40 players in total. Although it was at times a difficult season for the Division 2 side, Todd was always positive and had the best interests of the players and Club at the forefront. He was ably assisted by manager, Scott McNeillage, and my thanks also go to him.

The way we bowed out in the finals is one of only two disappointments I had in the year. The other was not being able to continue the Academy for young players from our junior pathway clubs. This is something we need to make sure we resurrect for 2016.

Nevertheless, in terms of giving new boys and younger players from our junior clubs exposure to Under 19s football, I think we have laid a good foundation for the future.

Between the two sides we had a total of 59 players who wore the mighty 'red and blue'. Of those, 41 played Division One and 24 played in both sides.

Thirty five boys made their debut for the club this season, 21 in Division One. I think we have nineteen boys who move to senior footy next season and the quality of boys coming from our junior clubs looks very exciting for next year and beyond.

We also had 10 boys play senior footy this year, with eight playing Premier Division, of which five made their debut.

Congratulations to Nick Hey, Nathan Cooper, Connor Owen-Auburn and Brandon Clark who represented the NSW/ACT Rams and played NEAFL for either Sydney or GWS.

With so many new faces and some up and down form in the practice matches I was unsure what we had as we hosted reigning premiers, St George at MKO to start the season. In fact it wasn't MKO, but the lower ground for the first time, Greenway Park.

After a first half arm wrestle, the boys broke the game open with a ten goal to one second half and looked as though they'd been playing together for years.

What did we have on our hands here?

We then travelled to Manly for the twilight game which followed a stirring win by Prem's. We came home with a 72 point win and top spot.

We would stay on top for the remainder of the season.

We strung together fourteen wins in a row, the first ten quite convincingly apart from a close, hard fought night win at North Shore in round 7.

Our next four games, although wins, were not as convincing and we seemed to be getting through on raw talent and hardness rather than through our system and game-plan, which had been working so well in the front half of the season. Unfortunately, this shortcoming would stay with us until the end.

We then lost a close one to St George away and followed that up with a poor performance at home, smashed by North Shore by 79 points.

Finishing the season with two solid wins with much better system should have had us up and about come finals time.

We went into the second Semi Final with the carrot of securing a Grand Final berth. Unfortunately, we put in one of our poorest performances of the season and although we lost by only seven points, we were totally unaccountable and made numerous turnovers which UNSW/ES punished us with on the scoreboard.

The fortunate part of having earned the double chance was we were still alive, but had to face North Shore with a number of their Swans NEAFL players back in their side for the Preliminary Final.

The name of the game for us was to put enormous pressure on the opposition at every contest and to hit our targets.

North Shore, however, came out of the blocks the best, kicking the first three goals before we were able to steady and start to make some headway. By half time we were leading by 10 points after 35 minutes of high intensity, high pressure footy which we knew we were capable of.

After the main break we seemed to have all of the play in our forward half, but could only manage four behinds before the heavens opened up and we turned for home with same the 10 point margin.

Unfortunately for us, North Shore stepped up another gear and we were unable to go with them. Our season was over, in straight sets, with a 13 point loss in the Preliminary Final.

This was a disappointing end to a season which held so much promise. There's always plenty of "what ifs" and the boys certainly cannot be faulted for their effort in the prelim, although I can't stop thinking what the result in the second semi would have been if we'd played that same high pressure game.

But that's footy!

# Under 19 Division Two Coach's Report



## *"Playing the Numbers Game."*

In a competition that was dominated by the two teams that eventually competed in the Grand Final (Western Suburbs and Holroyd-Parramatta), Pennant Hills can be proud of how close they got to the finals. An appeal by Penrith against our 'approved' playing list (first rejected then upheld) and a one point loss to Moorebank proved to be the difference between playing finals and not.

Under 19s Division 2 had a very hard working, reliable core of players. They turned up to training, worked hard to improve their game, and were at games week in, week out. Unfortunately, for the team it was difficult at times to get all to arrive for games. This created a massive workload for those who did turn up to play and resulted in a couple of forfeits and other times when we played without a bench. The courage and guts of the core group of players cannot however be questioned. Two examples that come immediately to mind are:

- 1 Playing 14 against 16 on Monarch Oval, the largest ground in NSW, in 28 degrees. At the start of the game I said to the boys it would be the team who is prepared to continue to run hardest at the closing stages of the match that will win. At the third quarter break we were trailing. In the last quarter we kicked 5 goals to nothing. A credit to the boys.
- 2 Round 8 at home against Western Suburbs (the eventual flag winners). They had pasted us by 77 points at Picken in Round 2. We led them by about 7 points at 3 quarter time. Wests then put on a blistering 10 minutes in the last quarter and just pipped us by 17 points in the end. The boys were gutted. As a coach I was very proud of their fight.

Having a group of boys who had never really played together before, many who could not make training, makes it hard to get consistency across the team. What we were blessed with, as outlined, was heart and fight in our core group. Our back six were strong. When we had Darren Guanzon, Will Johnson and Ronnie Khoury across the back line the determination and hardness at the ball was excellent. Attacking runs from half-back by Cian Furlong, Harrison Meidler, Oliver Williams, Joel Cousens, Cam McBrien, Riley Cooper, Hayden Vandermeer, Maine Vidler, Hayden Reedy and others throughout the season were some highlights, turning defence into attack very rapidly at times. Often these boys were on rotations through our centre group. A lot of hard work but they applied themselves admirably.

Our engine room of the centres were a pleasure to coach and a credit to themselves and the Club. It is from here that most of the team award recipients came. No surprise due to the work rate from them. The Big Man, Jason Kevern rucked all season for us, getting better and better as the season progressed. It was his second and third efforts off the ground that were most pleasing. He was ably supported by our both Best and Fairest and Players Player recipient Adrian Colautti. Adrian is a hard-working, lead-by-example rover. Ably supported by Joel Cousens who never gives up, is a natural leader and drives all those around him for their best. Scott Brain, Jayden Roots, Zac Baglin, Bryce Hillig and the fast running Jeff Featherstone were other centre contributors throughout the season.

The "wide receiving" fast running wings were another highlight of the year. Most Improved player for the season (moving up later in the year and earning B&F votes in Division 1), Ben Woollett was a highlight. Not afraid of a contest in the air, or on the ground, and calm under pressure. On the other side of the ground a strong runner, consistent high performer, and supporting us from Westbrook Under 17s was Bailey Meidler. Bailey's skills on the run and his fearlessness are exceptional. We really look forward to him graduating into Under 19s full time. A few appearances by Mike Carroll in this position also added depth and flair to the team when he could assist.

Our forwards were hard working but often outgunned. This is no reflection on them, but injuries and unavailability most impacted us up forward. A nice pair of hands and straight kick was Callum McNeillage. He showed guts playing through injury most of the season. When he was hurt he would still play for the team. Oliver Stofka showed some excellent tough ball roving to get shots on or kick to our "red zone". Jack Bullmore gave us some height and fight up here at times. A highlight for me was when he played through the flu in Moorebank to help set up some shots on goal in our winning game Round 3 at Rosedale Park on a Friday night. With no subs, badly worn down by flu and wanting to come off at half time, the Coach demanded that he go out and show some heart. He gave it in spades in this game. Zac Baglin showed versatility as a small roving pocket with deadly snap shot. Bagging 6 in Campbelltown in the 28 degrees was another highlight of the season. Cam McBrien was also often used forward. His height and commitment to the contest was an asset. His commitment was also a detriment to the goal posts at times, as he slammed into them at speed with eyes only for the ball on a few occasions.

To the Under 19 boys I give my heart felt thank you for the season. In my years of coaching I can honestly say I have not had the pleasure of coaching such a dedicated and committed, to the Club, core of players. To that core well done, you are a credit to yourselves and are living examples of Pennant Hills ethos of 'Club, Team then Self'. Week in, week out, with lower numbers than our opposition you showed me this with your fight. It was no coincidence that it was this same core of players who made training each week, progressed to play Division 1 in some cases and dominated awards night. If this core comes back and we grow the attendance by others to training and to playing on match day, the team will be finals bound in 2016.

Thanks boys for the season. To Scott McNeillage, thank you for managing. A big thank you to the support given me by our fantastic Coaching Manager – Michael Cousens. You kept me focussed and sane throughout the season mate. To David Pinker, thank you for sharing your knowledge and treating the Under 19s as a single squad. It went a long way to keeping the team together. Phil Hare thank you for your support and great energy and enthusiasm for the club ... it is contagious!

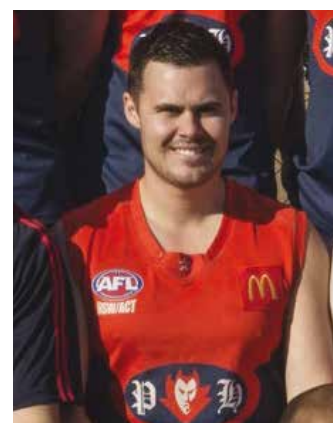

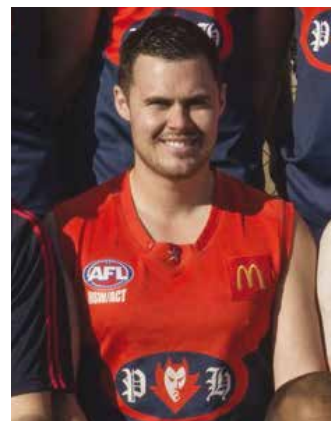

The financial outcome for Season 2015 can only be regarded as an excellent one.

An additional 2 teams this year meant a huge leap in our operating costs. A decision was made by the Committee to maintain the same player registration fees as for the past 2 seasons, despite the need to generate substantially higher income due to the extra 2 teams.

It costs the Club well over \$1,000 per player to field its teams, so recovery through registrations at \$390 per player (\$290 for Under 19) only goes a small way towards generating the income we require.

We are fortunate that our much valued sponsors helped us rise to the financial challenge, assisted by some sterling efforts by our volunteers none more than Allen Abbotts' efforts in running the new bar at Mike Kenny Oval.

Despite the excellent result in 2015, like all similar community clubs, Penno has a fairly fragile financial base and the Club can be put at risk through one poor season financially.

The small surplus generated this year belies the fantastic effort by our sponsors and fund raising supporters, players and office holders to generate the income required to achieve this result. The never ending increases in each of the core expenditure areas of AFL affiliation and umpires, insurance, ground hire, equipment and physiotherapy means a constant battle and reliance on the support of the Penno "faithful" and wider community at large in order to get our players on the field each week.

Season 2015 also saw close to \$30,000 worth of improvements in the change rooms and viewing areas and signage at Mike Kenny Oval.

With the Members' funds as at 30<sup>th</sup> September 2015 sitting at around \$81,000, the Club must continue to generate surpluses to build the Members' funds level back up to \$100,000 or more where it sat prior to the losses sustained in the initial years after transferring from Ern Holmes Oval to Mike Kenny Oval in 2011.

Well done to all who contributed to this season's excellent financial result, there will be many Clubs in Sydney and elsewhere envious of our being able to generate a surplus.

Let's all work together to ensure that situation is maintained in Season 2016 and beyond.

Daniel, Brooke, Annie, Steph and Jay – thank you all for your efforts week in and week out throughout the season. You have all been an asset to the Demons medical team, putting your hands up for whatever assistance was needed. It was fantastic to have 5 out of our 6 teams make finals this year, and due to the large number of players running around with niggling injuries, finals saw an increase in our medical team coverage, including the return of Andrew The Great! Thank you to Chris, Claudia, Lizan and Andrew for attending trainings twice a week throughout the finals and assisting on game day. The extra hands proved beneficial with an almost full team list presented to the coaches every week for finals games.

With Simon stepping up as the Premier Divison Physiotherapist, it is only appropriate for him to write the report hereon, so here it is direct from Simon.....

Firstly, to all the Premier Division players, it has been a pleasure to follow you all over Sydney this year and for most of the time, you listening intently to my advice. To YD, we can both have a break from our weekly phone calls that became more frequent as finals approached and then daily during grand final week. It is always fantastic to have the support of a coach during the difficult task of making hard decisions both during the week and on game day. So, thank you. To Macca, for passing my messages onto YD, even if it wasn't good news, it has been an awesome journey and your help is also greatly appreciated.

The most enjoyable aspect of my year, was to help out any player from every team, no matter what their division. I have appreciated the support of all coaches throughout this year. Seeing so many division 5 players attending the clinic and getting them back on the park each week was a feat in itself. To see Clarke and my Div 1 boys from last year, and to step it up another notch this year was truly extraordinary.

By good luck, fortune and some good management we had a relatively good year on the injury front. I must acknowledge the improved commitment to all boys in getting their injuries or niggles addressed each week and subsequently getting back on the park. Like every year though, there are always injuries. The first half of the year saw more injuries than the second half. Our last major injury was Mick Cantrall's depressed skull fracture requiring an urgent trip to the hospital. It wasn't until the end of the season that I was informed, these were the only three boys who were unavailable for selection for both the Premier and Division 1 Grand Finals; a remarkable achievement!

Injury Clinic grew again this year with 2 more teams attending. Monday night seemed like Pennant Hills AFL took over Carlingford Active Health, for what the boys deemed "the best way to spend a Monday night."

With 5 weeks left in the season and finals fast approaching a few boys were trying to convince me to attend Mad Monday. Despite their persistent efforts, I politely declined. Their attention then turned to me attending the annual Footy Trip. Again, I politely declined. However, the boys were not giving up this time! A proposal was put forward that I would attend footy trip if Premier Division won the Grand Final. I was only too happy to hold up my end of the bargain after one of the greatest win's I have ever been involved in.

What a year, Bring on 2016!
