Welcome - President's Report



Looking back at the past 12 months there is a significant amount to reflect on!

With a massive 8 teams taking the field each week, a record 278 players pulled on the 'Red & the Blue' in 2018. Highlights included 40 players getting a game in Premier Division, 7 of which were debutants, 86 players got a kick for Division 3 and 65 females played across our two Women's teams.

This year 6 of our 8 teams qualified for finals with Premier Division missing out on finals by the smallest of margins. While the U19's had a tough year, results-wise I have no doubt the building blocks Trent and his team have put in place this year will hold them in good stead for next. A special mention should go to our Women's Division 2 team who competed against 12 other teams to qualify for finals in just their first year!

Jak Stromquist, Mikaela Mahony, Bailey Miedler, Tom Angel and Ranga Ediriwickrama all finished top 10 in their Division Best and Fairest whilst Alex Huggins and Pat Witt took out the highest individual honour winning their respective Division Best & Fairest. Club Legend Chris Yard, who celebrated 200 games as a Demons coach this year and has more than 500 games as player/coach, was also inducted into the Sydney AFL Hall of Fame — congratulations YD!

Whilst winning individual awards is great, nothing compares to the enjoyment experienced by our Men's Division 1 and Premier Division Reserves boys who both had come-from-behind victories to take out the Premiership! Congratulations to Todd Williams, Brendan Gregor, Boxy, Clarkey, Razor, Michael Trenaman, Patty Witt and all the players and volunteers who had a part in winning the Flag. Personally, the highlight for me from these two victories, was the large number of players who weren't involved in either game that came up to share with me their sheer enjoyment they got watching their clubmates achieving the ultimate success. This only further reinforces what a great, close-knit community club we are.

Off the field we had mixed results this year. We probably underestimated the cost impacts of fielding an additional 2 teams. I think many would be surprised that, despite fielding 278 players this year, the cost to the club per player is just short of \$1200. Given all players pay just under \$500 each for registration it is always an uphill battle for the club to find ways to bridge that \$700 per player gap. This is where we so heavily rely on the generosity of our sponsors as without them we simply do not have a club. Your continued support not only allows for over 200 people to participate in a sport that they love but also brings much enjoyment on a weekly basis to the hundreds of family members, partners and friends in our local community who also have a passion for our football club. If Pennant Hills wants to continue to grow and remain one of the powerhouse clubs of the Sydney AFL we really need our club to embrace the motto "Many hands makes light work". With the introduction of our new club rooms we have a fantastic opportunity to create an environment where people look forward to coming down to a Demons game, not only to watch and support but also to help out, get involved and really embrace our 'Club-Team-Self' ethos.

Secretary's Report



Our Club grew to another level in 2018 with a Club record 8 teams comprising 5 senior men's teams, 2 women's teams and an Under 19 team, with well over 220 registered players. Six of those 8 teams made finals with only Premier Division and Under 19s missing out, Premier Division finishing equal third (but sixth) and literally being within one kick of making the finals and setting up for a 2017 like run to the flag. So on the field a successful year.

The Club is now however more than a collection of like-minded football enthusiasts. It is an important community body which provides a social environment not only to the 220+ players but also hundreds of supporters, parents, friends etc.

With that comes an administrative burden which requires contribution by a large number of volunteers to enable the Club to function both socially and commercially, given it is a medium size commercial operation which requires income of around \$1,100 for every player it puts on the field. These volunteers are required in many roles both on field (coaches, runners etc) and off field (match day, admin/financial, sponsors etc).

As mentioned, season 2018 was an exciting one with a record number of teams and players, six of the teams playing finals and two teams winning treasured premierships. At times the Club struggled however to man all volunteer posts required to ensure the Club operates at an optimum level.

The fact we enjoyed such on field success tended to mask the fact the people running the Club are finding it difficult cover all the functions required to be performed. This will need to change in Season 2019 and beyond and steps are being taken to implement a structure which will require more people of help out and spread the areas of responsibility into self-reporting divisions operating under the umbrella of the Club Executive and Committee.

People owning and doing functions rather than just informing office holders what needs to be done. The alternative would mean they may need to shrink the Club in future years to a level where volunteers in place can manage the jobs required to be performed. No one wants that

Despite the massive growth of the Club, we managed to cover costs and generate a tiny profit, with the help of State Government Grants obtained by vigilant Committee Members.

We are indebted to our at times under recognised Club Sponsors, without whom we would simply cease to function. Please support our Sponsors, remember that they support the Club in the most material way possible.

Keeping the finances in check during such a growth stage is a big job and recognition needs to be made of our Treasurer Brendan's job over many years now. His budgeting has been spot on and importantly the Committee and the Executive at all times are aware how we are travelling. This is result of many long sessions wading through the large number of transactions now generated through the Club.

Then there is the big one, the new clubrooms and ground development, courtesy of a wonderful effort by the Federal Member for Berowra, Julian Leeser MP, who assisted the Club to play a critical role headed by Phil Hare in establishing the "Upgrade Greenway" initiative. This resulted (due to Julian's ongoing support and lobbying) in a Federal Government Grant of \$2.7 million to redevelop Mike Kenny Oval (\$900k) improve the

existing change rooms (\$200k) and construct a Greenway Sports House Club Room (\$1,600,000). It will become the home of Penno and the other Clubs involved in the initiative (Westbrook Junior AFC, Greenway Giants Baseball Club, Penno Stags Rugby League Club, Cherrybrook Little Athletics, West Pennant Hills Cherrybrook Cricket Club and Cherrybrook Netball Club). The Clubs involved salute your efforts Julian on behalf of the Greenway Community.

The Mike Kenny Oval improvements should be ready for Season 2019 and the clubrooms building is hoped to be constructed by mid-2019. These new clubrooms should provide a new and better Club experience in future years.

Hopefully we will have the volunteer network in place to enable the Club experience to be what we want incorporating the famous Penno culture.

I need to thank my fellow Executive Members, Josh, Phil and Gunner all of who go "above and beyond" as do all our Committee Members, Coaches and Volunteers to make Penno such a special Club, one we want to continue to evolve in our new environment.

Football Manager's Report



Season 2018 promised to be another successful year at our club with expectations again very high with our Premier Division team setting the competition benchmark as reigning premiers, our depth of quality young players coming thru the ranks, and the addition of 2 new teams for the year.

After a yearlong review by Sydney AFL, both Men's and Women's competitions were restructured for season 2018 and our first decision from a football perspective would be how many divisions Pennant Hills would participate in, and whether we had the player numbers and support structure to be competitive?

We nominated for all 5 Men's Divisions (1 addition to 2017), 2 Women's Divisions (1 addition to 2017) and retain 1 under 19's team. In effect, we would go from a 6 team club to 8 teams and this guaranteed challenges in securing more players, coaches, assistant coaches, team managers and game day support if we were to be successful. But to remain the progressive club we have been since our inception, and the lead club in driving interest for AFL football at the grass roots level across the Sydney Hills district, widening our football community was an obvious conclusion.

The clubs decision was vindicated early by the fantastic player numbers at pre-season training, and the positive environment create with additional men and women participating in what was a pretty tough schedule to get our players fit for the long season ahead. I remember many February/ March Thursday nights where the post training BBQ represented a Bali beach at dusk, with sweaty young people hanging around and just having fun and enjoying each other's company. A great place to be!

With the exception of our Men's Div 3 and Women's Div 2 teams, all coaches were locked in early by securing Todd Williams as our Men's Div 1 coach, Tim (T-Bone) Wolnizer as Mens Div 2 coach, and Mark Carroll appointed in a new role of Head of Women's Football. These guys joined our panel of experienced coaches Chris Yard (Premier Division), Jason Clarke (Premier Reserves), Trent Roddan (U19's), and Daniel (Fids) Fiedler (Women's Div 1). We are ever grateful for Phil "I'll just do the first few games" Hare for taking up Div 3 coaching role and Steph Tate for sacrificing her own playing ambitions to coach Women's Div 2. Furthermore, we welcomed Lloyd Shepard joining Yardy as Prems Assistant Coach, Brendan Gregor and Nathan (Boxy) Breen as Div1 Assistant Coaches, and Nigel Blow U19 Assistant Coach.

Sydney AFL joined the National AFL introduction of a new pre-season concept AFLX, an 8 player game, played essentially on a soccer size ground with heavily modified rules and 24 mins of game time. Pennant Hills was one of only 4 Sydney clubs invited to participate in a round robin competition at Moore Park played late February. The season had begun!

The coaches' season reports will cover the team performances in depth, but to summarise 2018 from a football operations perspective, our scorecard was impressive. Prems just missing the finals by 0.4% was mind wrenching for Yardy and the team and forced reflection on every match, every missed shot at goal, every selection decision etc etc. Being the form team running into the finals yet missing out by the slimmest possible margin delivers little satisfaction (except for other teams participating in finals), and is a lesson for the future that every minute of every game is critical in a such an even competition. Time to move past what could have been and instead take the learnings into next year. Thanks to Yardy, Shep, Macca and of course our sensational Team Manager John Acheson for their ongoing commitment and effort during the season.

Reserve Coach Jason Clarke's face of satisfaction, pride and achievement in winning the premiership after many attempts over the past 19 years is cemented in my memory forever. The pain of a 1 point Grand Final loss in 2015 was erased for Clarkey and this team, and didn't we all enjoy it. The efforts of Wayne Keating (Assistant Coach), Michael Trenaman (Team Manager), Phil Scarlett (long time reserve grade Team Manager) and our players over recent years being finally rewarded with the ultimate prize was uplifting and a season highlight for our club.

Equally impressive was the turnaround season for Div 1 Men's resulting in another premiership for our club. Todd, Brendan, Boxy and Team Manager Henri de Gorter built a formidable combination, and led the charge which allowed many of our players to taste premiership success for the very first time. It's tough to win one flag in a season, but to win two is a year to remember.

Our depth at Pennant Hills is evidenced by Men's Div 2, Div 3 and both Women's teams also participating in finals footy, and under 19's just missing the action. Thanks to all who supported these teams during the season, but recognition and appreciation for men's coaches T-Bone, Phil, Trent, and Women's coaching panel led by Mark, Fids, Steph, Brendan Wray (Women's Div 2 Assistant Coach) and of course the backbone of Women's footy at our club, Al Abbott.

I also extend gratitude and thanks to Stuart Woodward who again played a critical role of Junior Liaison Officer, and Henri de Gorter for mastering the co-ordination of club umpires for the season. My thanks to game day heroes, timekeepers and match admin duties carried out by lan Parker, Matt Lee, Rod Miles, Alan Brawn and Col Huggins who work tirelessly again this season. And of course Lauren Wright and her outstanding team at Carlingford Active Health for the physiotherapy and trainers duties performed. Umpires, Trainers, Timekeepers are largely thankless jobs within any football club, but without them, each week's games just wouldn't go ahead. Thank you all for your help.

I'm enormously proud our of team captains recognised throughout this year book. Great people leaders set the player culture at Penno and this year's crop was first class. Thank you and well done.

In closing, we set a high benchmark at Penno, and whilst two flags is just awesome on any clubs scorecard, my highlight from a football angle is the positive impact Pennant Hills FC creates for young men and women to be fit, healthy and involved in an inclusive environment, is something everyone at our club can be proud of, and may we continue to set benchmarks for Sydney AFL football again in 2019 and beyond.

Premier Division Coach's Report



Two premierships in 3 seasons (2015 and 2017) means that Pennant Hills Premier Division is the team that every other side in the competition wants to beat. It's been that way for a number of seasons and this year it seemed all the more intense. The same can be said for the expectation of our club, but winning premierships is certainly no easy task with a modicum of luck needed over the journey.

Season Summary

Our season commenced with a 2017 Grand Final replay against Sydney University. We were well beaten by 9 goals by a side that was certainly impressive for Round 1. Despite the early stumble, the season progressed well. We were sitting at 8 wins, 2 losses after 10 games. Wins in this patch against both Sydney Uni and East Coast Eagles were fantastic, the brand of football displayed was as good as I've seen for some time. We then had a tough stretch of 4 consecutive losses, against UNSW, Manly, St George and North Shore. UNSW and Manly were tight (5 and 14 points) and then we were very disappointing against St George in the Return to the Ern game and then well beaten by a strong North Shore team.

After losing our way, the confidence of the group was a little shaken, however, the team was certainly keen to re-bound as the season was still on the line. The ladder positions had certainly tightened up and we were just holding onto a position in the five. With 4 games remaining, we needed to win 3 of them to participate in finals. We beat UTS in our highest score for the year and then fell to East Coast by 8 points. Camden were next and our 37 scoring shots to 11 saw us win convincingly. It came down to the last round, with a number of teams on the same points, Pennant Hills in 6th position. We had to beat second placed UNSW (the eventual Premiers) and East Coast had to go down to North Shore, the minor premiers. We completed what we could control, beating UNSW by 2 goals. As our boys left the field, the results of other games were coming through ... East Coast had lost, but unfortunately only by a solitary point. We fell agonisingly short of the finals by a fraction of a percent - equivalent to one measly goal as it turned out! What a deflating moment!

When all was said and done, it's fair to say that our depth was tested this year with a number of our younger premiership players from 2017 unavailable due to commitments at higher levels. A number of players have gained some valuable experience and are ready to step-up to the next level. We will look back on the lean patch we had in the middle part of the season and ensure we learn and grow.

Our early finish with an extended break will allow us to recharge and reassess. I'm sure we'll all come back with renewed enthusiasm to ensure we return Penno to its rightful place - in the finals.

Division One Coach's Report



Premierships aren't given they have to be earned and it was a privilege to coach a team that earnt a Premiership. Throughout the season the Division 1 men's team utilised 65 different players. To get consistency in a game plan and style of play was no easy matter. To develop trust and instinct required to win required lots of work at training and in belief on the field.

The addition of a new coach and the above factors made for a very slow start to our season. At the mid-season review we sat mid-table, even wins and losses on about 100 percentage points. This accurately reflected what we were doing. We were not taking the game on, being merciless to teams or playing four quarters of football. It was time to sit down for the review and put it all out there. We all had to trust each other, agree on our goals and commit to working towards them.

The coaching group presented the facts and our thoughts and belief in the squad. We said that a 10% increase in our skills and application would make this competition ours for the taking. We knew we had that level of improvement in the squad. The floor was opened up to the playing group resultant in a matter of fact discussion. Everyone went away with a commitment to do all we could to win this competition, all with the shared belief that we could do this if we all wanted to. We set ourselves the goal of winning the remainder of our games and sitting at the end of 17 rounds at 12 wins, no more losses and carry the one draw though. We wanted to improve our percentage by being merciless to teams when on top. The ladder at the end of the season saw us miss the win/loss ratio by one game, this was our last home and away game and was the "kick" we needed leading into the finals. Finishing second meant we played first in the semi-final 2 with a chance to go straight into the Grand Final.

This was an outstanding achievement with 7 wins in a row the boys were working well and had the belief needed. All season we were blessed with a solid back seven, being Adam Smith, David Smith, Harry Rivers, Craig Maynard, Stewart Hodges, Timothy Acheson and Jack Watkins. Again and again this tight group thwarted opposition drive and turned it into attack for us.

Our mids were gelling well and playing smart, the return of Jake Gunstone late in the season from injury was a great injection into the squad. Captain Nathan Breen was directing traffic, Nick DeGorter, Pat De La Mare, Anthony Woodward, and Anthony Johnson were working hard on the in-side to give us best opportunity at first use of the ball. Our Ruckman, Charlie Allison was getting better and better each week, Charlie loves the contest was often dominating much senior ruckman and covering the entire ground.

Our outside centres had good speed so our game plan was to hit the ball hard in the mids and get it out to our runners. Harry Gregor, Tommy Gerard, Michael Fiedler, Jack Leedham and Sean O'Regan were awesome in the outside role, tenacious at shutting down the opposition, good tacklers and strong overhead. There leg speed got us away from the opposition many times.

Evan Danilo was solid and hard at the ground ball all season, covering a lot of territory as our centre Half Forward. With the ability to kick 60 metre goals he was a threat that drew opposition attention and helped to open up our forward line. Peter Carey was reliably kicking an average of 4 goals a game, he was our go to man at full forward. Our fast crumbers in Nick and Zac Baglin provided both dangerous ground ball options and excellent forward pressure on turn over. Nick is an excellent kick and gets some great air time if needed for a mid-size player.

As mentioned previously 65 individuals had been rotated through the Division 1 squad and this is testament to the depth at the club. Being able to draw on players that could fit straight in and play a role was vital to our success. Making this work was testament to the great support I was given by Brendan Gregor as assistant coach and Boxy on the field. Players like Ryan Isberg, Ben Woollett, Will Johnson, Michael Van Rooy, Hugh Yates and Adrian Colautti come readily to mind for providing this team with excellent service throughout the season when called up.

Two games stand out all season as the best display of our style of football. This was the round 10 Wollondilly game at Wollondilly and then the first quarter of our semi-final. At Wollondilly Brendan and I were rapt to receive great feedback from spectators on how good our game was to watch and how well the team moved the ball in attack and used each other. In defence we had shut them down to only two goals all game. Those who observed our first quarter in the Semi Final against Syd Uni were also elated at what they observed. We blew Sydney off the park in 20 minutes and then hung on with great defensive effort all across the ground to win by three points and head straight to the grand final in two weeks. What an emotional game.

Unfortunately, after great support by many players throughout the season, only 22 can be selected to play in the "Big Dance". With the promotion of Jake Gunstone we needed another tenacious and skilful mid fielder. Aidan Russell slotted straight in and had a fantastic game when we needed it. Up forward we were conscious of having as much fire power as we could in support of the ever reliable Peter Carey. With Fraser Nixon being available I elected to take him into the game. This meant dropping Zac Baglin who had played solidly all season at forward pocket. It was a hard decision and we missed his forward pressure early. But Frog kicked a crucial goal, Sean O' Regan had his game of the season in the Grand Final. Great positioning saw him kick three goals and take some strong marks and lay some great tackles when needed. Charlie Allison was brilliant and also snuck two goals and bolstering both our defence and attack when needed. Our back six were solid again with Harry Rivers shutting down opposition attack, David Smith being everywhere and the BOG winner for the final, Adam Smith, shutting them down and beating there zone to launch our attack on many occasions.

The Grand Final reflected our season. We started slow, showed patches of brilliance and had most of the possession after at one stage in the second quarter we had trailed by 26 points. The Penno crowd really got behind us as we went into the sheds at half time. The discussion was positive. We knew we could all lift and that our best was better than their best that they had already thrown at us. We needed to take this game on, be brave, use and trust each other and spread and run in attack, close up space and shut them down on turn over.

If you get to watch the final, on the AFL Sydney You tube channel, the commentators say it all:

"Pennant Hills had bit of a start slow but their finish was spectacular. They were so strong and physical and just relentless throughout the entire game. So credit to them."

What a great feeling to win the Premiership with this squad. Our strength all season, our 22, all lifted. It was hard to pick a best on ground. Most pleasing was that no one gave up on the dream. All stayed positive and fought till the final siren. The scoreboard tells the story of what a tremendous fight back this was:

Division Two Coach's Report



What started as a cheeky joke at last year's presentation evening quickly turned into a return to coaching for me this year, and what a decision it would be? With the change in competition structure the Penno fourth grade side competed against other Premier Division clubs third grade sides in Div 2 (with the exception of North Shore and Sydney University). What a challenge and opportunity for a predominantly under 22 (plus some token old guys) side to fast track some development for the club.

When reflecting on the season that was, I was drawn to the numbers to attempt to explain how the team, at the half way mark, had one win yet still made finals as a genuine threat. So, read on for the explanation by numbers of season 2018...

- 1. The 'point' differential between for and against for the year. It shows how close we were to the major contenders all year. More importantly, it kept our percentage in triple figures which for all intents and purposes points to a successful year. 1 was the amount of times we played on the bottom oval at Mike Kenny, the ground most of the players have gotten used to playing on for the majority of games during the last few seasons. 1 is also the amount of games 28 players played in Div 2 in 2018 and sadly, for a 'playing coach', the amount of games I managed for the year before requiring knee surgery.
- 3. Was the margin in two games this year: our poorest performance for the year in Round 3 against a far older (vintage) Manly outfit in the wet where discipline, intensity and a general ability to kick straight hurt us, and; our Round 16 loss to Camden which was, although a loss, quite possibly our best performance for the season. In a real positive for the team, 3 is also the position that our big man Jak Stromquist finished in the league medal for Div 2. Congratulations Jak on being recognised by Sydney AFL for a great season.
- 4. The margin of a heartbreaking loss against St George in Round 2 which showed Donny and myself just what we needed to work on without the presence of on-field-coaches (token old guys). This was something we addressed in the weeks to come as we made some positional changes to get more experience in each line group. This game was punctuated by a punctuation of Jason Clarke's finger bone through the skin which sadly meant we lost our 'gun forward' to the hospital, the surgeon's table and a few weeks on the sidelines recovering. 4 was also the amount of goals Fordy kicked on three different occasions including our big game against Camden to finish our highest goal kicker.
- 5. Our final ladder position and where Donny and I had expected us to be around at the end of the year. 5 was also the margin on the return fixture against Manly, a win that set us up for our run at finals and a 5-game winning streak that gave us revenge on early season losses to St George (big win at the Ern), North Shore and UTS. We also enjoyed beating East Coast again (the only win at 'Back to Baulko' day for the mighty Dees and the stage for Jason Clarke's amazing, unbelievable and ridiculous left foot goal... and celebration just ask him).
- 7. The amount in the Losses column at the halfway point of the season. When we hit the mid-year review it was borderline laughter when I said we would make finals. The results had not gone our way early in the season but, we felt that the ground work had been done. We had given new and younger players lots of opportunity to learn and improve and more importantly 7 is approximately the number of players who came back in across the higher grades to filter back players we expected to be regulars in Div 2. Finally, 7 was the total wins for the season just enough to see us into the finals.

- 9. Players who played Div 2 who also played in reserve grade or prems during the year (thanks for filling in Lloyd Shepherd).
- 23. Our core group of players who played 7 or more games. These 23 players were the regular performers and fostered a great team culture that welcomed all and sundry as they came in and out of Div 2 during the year.
- 46. Different players were named in our best six players at least once, including all 23 members of the core group. This really highlights the great individual performances and development of the entire playing group as well as the talent across the lower grade at the club.
- 77. The number of players to pull on the jumper for Div 2 throughout the year. This is definitely the biggest challenge as a playing group with many game's warm ups being utilised as speed dating for new players to introduce themselves and learn some names before ball-up.
- 100. My favourite number for the year, our percentage (100.14%) but more importantly the number of games for club president Josh Mott in a big win against UTS and his best game for the year, kicking 3 goals. And, 100% confidence in the group that we can be better next year and challenge for another Premiership for the mighty Demons!

Best and Fairest and Player's Player – Jak Stromquist

Jak had a break out season where he regularly beat opposition ruckmen, pushed forward to kick goals and, more pleasingly, discovered the defensive side of ruck work. His first six rounds demonstrated exactly why he finished so far ahead in the B&F yet he continued to be recognised throughout the year. Congratulations to his partner in crime Lachlan Ford who showed that the 'power couple' of Div 2 really were that this year finishing runner-up to Jak for both awards. Congratulations to both.

Most consistent - Cam McBrien

"I'll only play again if I can play in the ruck or up forward", it was a deal that lasted until we beat Manly with Cam at full back doing an absolute number on Adam Howarth. Cam kicked 3 goals in round one and 1 goal for the remainder of the year being after moving to his native backline. He played across all the key positions and covered injuries, absences and strategic changes with ease. He routinely beat his direct opponent and was reliable in any position and rightly deserves the award.

Best Team Man - Sean Dixon

A blow-in from SA with a penchant for parading around the grounds in nothing but a pair of Budgie Smuggler's⁰. Sean quickly became a regular in Div 2 and set about 'getting the boys around' and winning some games of football. Sean will claim we didn't win games until he played with us and that he is the reason we made finals... we'll let you have that one Sloppy!

Most improved – Matt Arciuli

This was the hardest award to give this year with a huge number of players putting their hand up. Matt was our quiet achiever going about learning the game and asking for little things to work on each week. He ticked these off week after week and ended up playing the most amount of games for the team, 16. Well done Matt, you've come a long way this season and will only get better in 2019.

Coaches award – Jarrod Venes

A move to the backline was all it took for Jarrod to hit his straps in 2018. A good user of the footy Jarrod was our go to foil for any situation and

Division Three Coaches Report



The addition of a fifth open age men's team would have been thought of fanciful in 2013 when we added, at a push, our third men's team. Fast forward 5 years and our Division 3 (fifth team) was an outstanding success.

A call out to our current and past players to recommend a mate to play AFL saw us field an incredible 85 players throughout the year. This allowed us to field 22 players in all but a couple of games throughout the year. This was highlighted with 13 players playing 2 games and an incredible 35 players only playing a single game for the year; not sure about the quality of coaching with a retention rate that low. Seriously though, to attract that many new players to the club could only have occurred because of our current players telling their friends it is a great place to play footy. A special mention to Emma Wade, Tim Wales and Jackson Preedy who recruited more than 7 players each to play through the year.

On-field our results were nothing short of amazing. With as many as 10 changes each week players were still getting to know each other's names through to the last round of the season.

At the end of the home and away season Division 3 had only lost 4 games , we finished third on the ladder and qualified for the double chance and had beaten all other teams in the finals including beating the eventual premiers Sydney Uni, both times in the home and away season. Unfortunately, we lost both finals including a 5 minute each way extra time final after scores were drawn with Macquarie Uni.

Highlights of the season were many but included;

- Alexander Huggins deservedly winning the league medal in Division 3 (they need to name a league medal after Huggo).
- Our second final against Sydney Uni comprising 12 players who were playing their first year of AFL.

- John Hound Rakic starring in our win over Sydney Uni with Mitch Quarrel kicking the winning goal with 30 seconds left to play.
- Haydn McLean and George Fourtsadakis travelling from Cronulla to play each week.
- Daz Boulet returning for his 10th season and a total of 70 games.
- James Carrington kicking goals, taking marks, delivering bone jarring bumps and still not knowing any of the AFL rules.
- The improvement of so many players including Zac Morris, Charlie Godfrey, Jack Crampton, Tim Steel, Mike Baldry, Jordan Denton.
- The ageless Jeff Hardman controlling the backline.
- The 4 goal haul (out of 5 goals) by Trent Roddan in the first final.
- The mercurial Mike Baglin kicking goals over his head, from the boundary line and crumbing out the pack each week.
- Danny Strange returning mid-season and still only knowing the names of half his teammates in our last final.

Our Award winners for the 2018 season were deservedly;

Alex Huggins (Best and Fairest) — could seriously still play Prems if he wanted to (and the body would hold up). A great example to new players on how to play the game, how to stick up for your mates and importantly for Div 3 how to enjoy yourself after the game.

Haydn McLean (Runner up Best and Fairest) — travelling from Cronulla each week and then dominating. Single-handedly won us games as a key defender (Mac Uni away) and the next week single-handedly winning the game as a key forward (Sydney Uni).

James Adams (Most Consistent) – starting the year as a forward, moving the mid field and then finding his perfect fit on the half backline. Consistently in the best players each week as a quality defender with excellent skills. Should be in higher grades next season after a big preseason.

Mike Baldry (Best Team Man) — in only his second season of AFL, Mike developed into our key Ruck / Forward role. His work rate exceptional and improvement through the year excellent. With that a quality young man, always a positive attitude demonstrated by wanting to get back on the ground after getting a tooth knocked out, Mike is clearly our best team man

Jack Crampton (Most Improved) — a member of the Kings Rugby trio (Charlie Goofery, Jordan Denton and Jack) improved each game of the year. Finally, it was a pleasure to coach an exceptional group on young men. Many of these players juggled work, family and travel to not only play football, but to choose to play for our club. I am sure we now have another 86 people who view AFL as the best game in world and Penno the best AFL Club in Sydney.

Under 19 Division One Coach's Report



Firstly congratulations to the Reserve Grade and Division 1 Men's teams for both winning flags this season. Well done Jason and Todd and your support team for all your efforts in 2018.

Unfortunately the U19s we were not quite able to follow suit, and to sum up our year as not one of the best is fair, winning only 3 regular season games and awarded one game through forfeit is not how we normally want to finish the season in U19s.

We did however come very close to winning 3 more games though the season, losing by less than 10 points (one game by a solitary point) which, had we won them, would have seen us make finals. So close yet so far away.

Our playing group in 2018 started with 29 players, including 5 new players joining the Penno family (3 of whom were new to AFL). We also played 10 U17 top up players toward the end of the season bringing the total to 39 players during the year.

This relatively small playing group were unluckily decimated with 7 serious injuries this season, losing 5 players from our top 10 playing group with major or season ending injuries, and 2 more from the rest of the playing group (notwithstanding the other minor 1 or 2 match soft tissue issues). Whilst this is not an excuse for our on field performance, it is a significant factor when we didn't have huge numbers to begin with, and to compound the problem there wasn't an opportunity to draw on the U17s for top up players early in the season when we needed it most.

While it wasn't the best season on field for the U19s this year, we must always remember that the U19s program at Pennant Hills is all about player development and player retention in AFL. As such we were excited to see Matthew Browne, Jordan Adams and Harry Maguire elevated to Prems through the season, with Brownie performing well (especially in front of a hostile crowd in Camden), and Jordan maximising his opportunity, being nominated for the Sydney AFL Rising star award, and also winning our Prems 'Best First Year Player' award.

Mitch Blow, Harry Maguire, Nick Carter, Bailey Miedler and Matthew Browne also played Reserves at times through the year, with Mitch and Harry both playing in the Ressies grand final winning team.

Mitch had an outstanding season, not only winning our U19 B&F, but he also played the most games of any player across the club this season, polling well in B&F and PP votes in all grades and teams he played in. I can't wait to see his football develop even further next season.

We also had a hand full of other U19 players played in our open age Div 1,2,3 teams this season including, Ollie Nockles, Daniel Crompton, Sam Plummer, Ezra Pedderson, and all received praise for their efforts from the respective coaches they played for.

As mentioned earlier, injuries really affected our player numbers this season, with us having to play with no subs on the bench for a couple of games. Both Matthew Browne and Mitch Blow played games for U19s at times through the season when they could well have played Prems or Reserve grade matches. They did this to ensure we could field an u19s team. Thanks Matthew and Mitch for showing the true Penno spirit of Club Team Self.

We also saw Bailey Miedler come very close to winning the U19 Kealy Medal this season, finishing only 2 votes behind the winner, which was a great effort considering how few games we actually won. Bailey was also our leading Goal Kicker for 2018 with 17 goals.

I honestly have to say I'm very happy with all the players in our team this season, as they were challenged many times through the year both on and off the field, always finding the resilience to bounce back and stay in the fight.

All players made improvements to their game this season, and we had one of the best training attendance rates for many years, with some players that were ready to quit football after juniors, finding enjoyment in football again and becoming very important key players in the team.

Another factor which made this group enjoyable to coach, was having a fun social culture within our club (which the U19s embraced in a big way). Penno is more than just a footy club, it's a great place to be, and that is something we can all be proud of.

The U19s group is always one of the hardest coaching jobs at Pennant Hills, as players get moved in and out of the team on a weekly basis to a variety of other commitments such as Prems, Ressies, Swans NEAFL, Giants NEAFL, Academy Matches, State rep matches, U17 team needs, School, Work, School Sport, Family Commitments, Girlfriend Commitments (yes you know who you are).

Having only one U19 side means we have mixed talent and ability from elite to beginner, which often makes it hard to compete with clubs that have two U19 teams, as it allows them to have the top 50% of their players in their Div 1 side, where we must bring players from all levels in to compete with them. If you look at the final ladder for the regular season from this year, all 4 finals clubs from U19 Div 1 had 2 sides to pick from.

One of my proudest moments over the last three years coaching the U19 group has been to watch the progress and development of our elite players. This year we were excited to see two players that have come through our club, Ely Smith and Kieren Briggs get drafted to AFL clubs.

Ely played much of his junior footy with Westbrook, and when he came into our U19s team made an immediate impact as a solid ball winning midfielder (it was a shame we only had him at the club for 1 season).

Kieren came from Pennant Hills Juniors and played through our U19s for 1 season before being elevated to Premier division where he was one of seven U19 players that year who went on to help our club win the 2017 Premier Division Premiership.

The future continues to look very bright for us in the U19s, with both of our U17 feeder club teams in the Northern Lights Alliance making finals in their respective grades in 2018 (Div 1 and Div 3), with many of these players rolling up to join us in season 2019.

We are also hearing that in 2020 Sydney AFL are looking at returning to an U18 and U16 age group format (rather than U19 and U17), which means we will gain many players when that happens who will provide opportunity for us to again have 2 U19s teams. However time will tell on this.

On a personal note I am stepping down as U19 head coach. 2018 was always going to be my last season as U19s Coach, and I am handing over the reins to Drew Maddock for 2019. I had always committed to

coach the U19s for a minimum of 3 years as David Pinker had done before me, as I believe continuity is important with the U19s program, and I'm pleased to say that Drew is very keen to continue with a similar approach to the U19s in 2019 and I look forward to working closely with him in season 2019 to ensure a smooth transition.

As always, a special thanks goes out to my support crew from this season, Corey Matthews and Roma Unwin who were my Co-Managers through the year, Adam Kinach who was runner for most of the year and who also helped out at training. Thanks to Harry Rivers for shifting the magnets around the board when he could, and finally a massive thanks to Nigel Blow for being the assistant coach for us this year, his words of wisdom always keeping me positive when things were not going quite to plan.

Thanks also as usual to the rest of the coaching and football department, but a special thanks to Aaron Crisfield, Tom Edmonds and Jackson Potter for coming to training sessions to assist the team, and thanks to Michael Cousens and Rod Miles for also communication an outside opinion to the playing group, as this showed that the rest of the club was behind us and i know the players were very appreciative of this.

And finally thanks to all of the committee, because without the huge effort put in by all involved in the club administration, we simply would not have a club to be a part of.

Women's Division One Coach's Report



In the third season for Penno's Women's Division One, we had stepped our level of footy and playing style up a notch, and had achieved great successes both as a team and as a squad as a whole. The new players this year learnt the game faster than I've seen previously, and adapted to training and game play in such a way that it made it easier for myself and the other coaches to develop the team's skills. Returning Captain Eleanor Rugg and newly appointed vice-captain Maddy James helped form our greater squads leadership team, which provided not just match day commitments but also off the field work as well. By the end of the season, we had 49 unique players step on the field for Division One, with the majority being girls that had not played a season prior. Our goal this year was to make the grand final with smaller goals set throughout the season on how we were going to achieve this feat.

After ending our 2017 season in 4th after winning one finals match, we knew that it was going to be a tough pre-season, but the commitment to training was the best we'd seen to date, and was mostly greater than all of the men's sides. With last year's division being split into two competitions, there were going to be no easy wins this season, and our goal was to be inside the top 2 after the first half of the season. By round 4 we were 2nd out of 8 teams in the competition, only losing to 2017 premiers Wollongong in the process. By this point in the season, our line groups all had leadership and a main focus, which we changed per game depending on each opponent. Going deep into September footy was now within our sights, after already playing 3 of the top 5 teams and knowing that we had a lot of growth still to come.

By round 8 we were still only one win down, tying first (2nd on percentage) with Wollongong, having beaten arch rivals East Coast Eagles after a thrilling, hard-hitting game. The next week we had the 1st play 2nd game, and it was going to be a tough one, but we knew we could win after training specifically on a defensive structure to counter Wollongong's two best players and their run and kick into the centre of the forward 50. Unfortunately, they were just too good on the day and we were beaten mercilessly 97-13, which was a real eye opener after believing that we had a good chance to match up against them. Our biggest task at this point was to focus on making each player accountable, as if each and every one of our players could beat their opposite, we would win the game. This was the philosophy that I chose to use for the next few games while we slipped into 3rd, on equal points with East Coast. The training sessions in the next two weeks were the key to getting back our belief, and we pumped UNSW 114-1 as a result, in preparation for another big game against East Coast the following

We ended up losing by 2 goals against the rivals, marking the first time we'd lost to them in our short history, further dampening our belief in that we deserved to play finals footy. From here I really pushed our girls at training, after losing due to lack of run and supporting our team mates in the contest. Trainings from here always involved some kind of pushed running, and a lot of specific drills working on protecting our player with the footy via shepherding and blocking. Second efforts were the key to winning these tougher games from here, and throughout the rest of the season we slowly but surely achieved this as players began kicking and following the ball, or hand passing and protecting afterward. This development was great to see from the girls as it showed that they were up for the challenge and it was all about playing as a team and sticking to our game plan, because we knew we had the skills to win this competition.

By round 15, we'd lost to Wollongong again, and last year's runner ups Western Magic for the first time this season, solidifying our spot in the finals at 4th (top 4 were finals bound). With two games left in the regular season, we knew he had to step up and get back into some consistency, as well as belief, which I made a heavy point about again after a month of disappointing results. Round 16 was against 5th placed Manly, who were not to be taken lightly. This game felt like the be-all-end-all game, which we had to win to prove to ourselves that we deserved a spot not just in the grand final but also in the finals. After one quarter we'd struggled to tackle the opposition, and didn't mark our players well in defence causing Manly to lead 25-6. Our team had never made a comeback win, and our patience with the ball and leading had to be our main focus coming into the second quarter. We put another goal on Manly, and they scored just a behind finishing half time down 26-12, after strong defence from Charlotte and brilliant leads from Ali and Emma.

Our final two quarters we had to further ramp it up with our physicalness and shepherding, which was provided from the centres with Mik, Hayley L, Madi H and Bec A all forming a fort in our forward 50 wall. The end of the third quarter saw the scores go up finishing 32-20, with just one quarter left to show just what we were made of. Our belief and heart in the fourth quarter was the best I've ever seen this team play with in its three years, winning the game 33-32 in the last minute, and holding on successfully with some brilliant defence from Telly and Lauren, but not without solid support in the forward line from Chloe and Jessie. In my opinion, this was our best win in the team's history, and I don't think I've heard our team sing louder than we had that day (or equivalent to any time we beat East Coast). I'll always remember this win because I told the team after the game - "I told you that you can win this, and it's just up to you believing in yourselves and your team mates, because you've got all the skills, you just have to put it all together like you did today, and we'll win this comp."

Finishing 4th after the 17 rounds and heading into the first final against East Coast was nerve racking for everyone, but we were all pumped and knew that if we'd played like we had earlier in the season against them, and as we did in the final quarters against Manly, that we could win this game. Unfortunately, we went down 39-21, after leading 20-12 at quarter time. We'd just run out of legs and as much as we cleared the ball out of our back 50 and into our forward line, the opposition always had an answer for us. This was a devastating loss, but reflecting on the season, we showed that we could beat any team on our day (Western Magic were premiers and we beat them earlier this season). This season had its highs and lows, but ultimately, finishing 4th is nothing to be ashamed of, and I'm proud of every Penno Angel that stepped onto the footy ground this year, for their guts, hard work and determination did not go unnoticed by myself and the other coaching staff.

A few special mentions:

- Mark Carroll, who as Head of Women's Coaching this year, was an
 excellent help to not just the girls in the squad, but also myself and
 Steph, who had to juggle often 40-50 girls at a time at training. He
 helped out wherever need be, whether it be coaching or running,
 but he supported both teams and treated everyone with the utmost
 respect, and was an absolute pleasure to have around. Hope to see
 you on board next year!
- Terry Donohoe, the club legend who has always helped out wherever needed, and kept Laura in check when she was loving the umpires.
 Thanks Terry for everything and bringing more knowledge (both in

game and at training) to myself and the other coaching staff.

- Jess Taylor and the physio team for another great year, but with less broken fingers and more niggling injuries to keep track of - you put us on the park every week! Thank you!
- Alex Wade, who quietly was the manager for our team all season, while on an injury hiatus from the game. You clearly learnt from the best and was great having you back on the park in the last few games - an absolute gun in the half back line who was only just getting back into the swing of things. 2019 will be huge for you!
- Alan Abbott, who as Division Two's manager, always steps into any
 role he can, not just for the women's teams but also for the club.
 You will always be this clubs greatest asset to the girls and no
 matter what, you've been forever immortalised in our teams official,
 unofficial name "Al's Angels".

Steph and Brendan, for all their help coaching (especially as their first season coaching with over 60 girls total to juggle) and they did well to adapt to changes in their team via the domino effect.

In conclusion and finishing the season in 4th place, we will be back bigger and better next year. After a successful start from the Division Two (finals) as well, we can further build on the foundation of this squad. With only more success to come, this is a team that you'll be calling Premiers in the near future, hope to see you all again in 2019 for some more wins and even more planks at training!

Women's Division Two Coach's Report



This year saw a massive change in the women's squad. 32 new girls joined our Club, almost doubling our numbers from the year before. During pre-season training, new girls would rock up each week eager to learn the sport and have a go and on some nights there would be up to sixty girls at training!

I didn't expect to coach this year but a back injury during pre-season meant that I couldn't play or train for a while. As a new coach and with so many new players, I had no idea what to expect from the season. From my experience with my former club, the second side was for the 'social footballers'. I knew that from the ability and talent the new girls showed this would not be the case for us. Our team showed a level of tenacity and dedication which paid off as the season went on. We were fit, keen and wanted to get on the field. A total of 45 girls played in Division 2. Over the season, fourteen were then given the opportunity to play in Division One.

Our first game started with a massive win at home over Western Magic 58-8. Four girls kicked goals for the first time and it was an exciting game to watch. Under the eye of guest coach Bob Wray, the girls then followed up with a win against Auburn-Penrith 62-2 at Mona Park. We followed this up with a couple of strong wins over Manly and North Shore.

We took advantage of Athletic Tracker and were able to run a couple of video review sessions during the season. It took our training program to another level. Girls were able to see for themselves what they were doing. (I might have been guilty of watching my goal on repeat). Thanks to Trent Roddan for filming our games and providing this platform. Hopefully we can utilise this more next year.

By halfway through the season, we were sitting in fourth place on the ladder. The Division Two competition proved to be a mixed bag. There was a substantial difference in talent and skill across the competition. If we weren't getting massive wins we were suffering big losses. Combined with some season ending injuries, players promoted to Division One and the usual trips to Europe in July, we dropped down to 6^{th} spot.

With an unpredictable fixture and some more losses, we had to win as

many games to make finals. Our focus on the field turned to protection. Mark's mantra of 'Bring Out your Inner Bitch' was reinforced at every training session and game. We won two out of the final six matches. We beat UTS Shamrocks 14-13 in a tight, nail biting game. With possession predominantly in their forward line we were able to keep them scoreless in the last half and won the match by a point! I can still hear the screaming from the sidelines!

Our final match against South West Sydney resulted in a win putting us in 7^{th} place. Our fate then rested on other teams losing for us to make the finals. With Campbelltown beating Wollondilly by one point, we then were pushed up to 6^{th} place and finals bound! (Many thanks Campbelltown!)

Despite the loss it was still a major accomplishment for the team. 18 girls that played that day were in their first year of footy, and all 21 gave their all up to the final siren.

I would like to acknowledge and thank the following people for their help and support over the season: Mark Carroll, Brendan Wray, Matt Lee, the physios, and super manager Al Abbott. Without your help we would not have got this team on the field each week. To anyone and everyone who supported us this year, no matter how small, your input is appreciated.

Finally, to the girls. The way you carried yourselves on the field is commendable. Despite some losses you kept your heads high and continued to get around each other. Making finals was such a massive accomplishment for a new team. Watching you all develop and improve over the season has been remarkable. I have enjoyed playing and coaching with you all and I hope to see you all next year!





During the 17/18 financial year, despite a 33% increase in team numbers from 6 to 8, together with a reduction of almost \$9,000 in sponsorship income and an increase in expenses from \$239,520 to \$253,083, we managed to still generate a small surplus of \$4,068.

This was due primarily to:

- An increase in registration fees from \$56,286 to \$73,573.
- Increased canteen/bar net revenue from \$14,053 to \$21,179 thanks to the Pinker family and Allen Abbott.
- Individual social and fundraising events, in particular the Trivia Night and Grand Final Raffle which between them netted \$10,000 in revenue (great work Hare family).
- The expensing of earlier State Government Grants received pre 30.9.17 of approximately \$9,000 which reduced some expense areas such as playing equipment, footballs and clothing, safety equipment, much of it associated with the women's teams.

Total income was \$253,083 (previous year \$239,520) and expenses \$249,015 (previous year \$233,130). Notably, direct football related expenses increased by \$22,744 from \$143,520 to \$166,264, a trend that is hard to ignore as things like insurance and player care costs escalate dramatically each year.

Season 2019 will represent ongoing income challenges as costs go up on most fronts and sponsorship and fund raising becomes more and more difficult. As at 30.9.18 net Members Funds sat at \$96,851 compared with \$92,783 at 30.9.17.

The 2019 season and beyond will create an exciting environment around the Club with ground improvements and the construction of the new clubrooms. Hopefully this will also present income generating opportunities but at the same time there will be some additional expenses incurred in outfitting the new clubrooms.

Importantly we must continue to support our much valued sponsors without whom we would not be able to contemplate fielding more than 3-4 teams, let alone the Club record 8 teams we fielded in 2018.


